General Information:


- Victoria is located in the south-eastern part of Australia
- Melbourne is the largest city and the capital of Victoria
- 70% of the Victorians live in Melbourne

Geography:

- Murray-Darling Basin
- Great Dividing Range
- Great Ocean Road
 - Twelve Apostles

Climate:

- varied climate
- winter sports in the Victorian/Australian Alps
- heavy rainfall along the Great Dividing Range
- wettest Australian state after Tasmania

Economy:


- the gold rush led Victoria to the second largest economy in Australia
- Victoria represents 25% of Australia's economy
- a lot of agriculture situated in southern Victoria

History:

- Aborigines lived in the area of Victoria 40000 years ago
- 1835: Melbourne founded by John Batman and John Pascoe Fawke
- 1851: the discovery of gold attracted immigrants from China and Europe
- 1851: Victoria became a colony separate from New South Wales
- 1865: Melbourne overtook Sydney and became Australia's largest city
- 1901: Commonwealth of Australia is founded, Melbourne became the national capital until 1927

Sport:

- Victoria is the center of Australian Rules Football ("Footy")
- the state holds ten of the sixteen clubs of the Australian Football League
- other sports are rugby, basketball, cricket, soccer, motor sports, winter sports and hockey

Melbourne

General Information:

- with a population of 3.806.092 habitants and a population density of 1566 habitants per square kilometer, Melbourne is the second most populated city after Sydney
- founded on 30th of August 1835 as a small village, Melbourne soon became the biggest city in Australia
- the size and wealth of Melbourne are a result of the Victorian gold rush in the 1950s
- Melbourne is situated around a bay called Port Phillip
- size: 8806 km² (3,7% of Victoria)

Culture:


- lots of different arts performed in and around Melbourne
- from the performing arts (ballet, music...) up to the visual arts (painting, sculptures...) as well as architecture
- Melbourne was and still is the cultural and financial capital of Australia

Transport:

- Melbourne has the largest tram network in the world!
- even though its tram network is well established, there is still 14 times more car traffic

Economy:

- the economy in Victoria is based mainly in Melbourne
- the economy of Melbourne alone is comparable to that of some smaller Asian countries
- a lot of agriculture as well (24% of Australia's agriculture are in Victoria), 60% of the land is in agricultural use
- Victoria is not only the business center of Australia, it is also the food supplier!
- some of Australia's biggest enterprises are based in Melbourne, such as Foster's Brewing, BHP Billiton, National Australia Bank, but also international enterprises like IBM or Hewlett Packard
